

OUTSTANDING ALUMNI AWARD 2018 JAMES "MOON" MALONE — Class of 1969

There is so much to say about James "Moon" Malone — a true gentleman, a great friend, and a thoughtful and loved family member. He was involved in many school activities; Moon played sports — football, track, and was in the W Club; he was also in concert and stage bands as well as concert choir; and, he was selected as one of the 1969 Outstanding Seniors.

After attending CSU, Moon joined the Denver Police Department in 1972 where he worked in District 4. He was a Detective in the Child Protective Section and was selected as part of the Mayor's Executive Security team for both Mayor Wellington Webb and John Hickenlooper. Moon was awarded several police awards including the highest citation awarded by the police department — the Medal of Honor — for rescuing and saving the lives of several individuals who had been kidnapped and possibly would have been murdered. His lifelong West High friend, Lester Smith, also served in the Denver Police Department and they remain close friends. Moon is also on the 1969 Annual Christmas Ornament Exchange Committee.
